## Notes

- Skill level = Beginner
- WOF = Width of fabric
- RST = Right side together
- FQ = Fat Quarter
- Pattern assumes WOF to be 42"
- All seams are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.

- Fabrics used in the quilt are : Dear Stella Fabric Basic Collection, Dash Flow (Phantom) & Ruby Star Society
- I recommend prepping all fabric by spraying 40% Terial Magic 60% Best Press with a continuous spray bottle on the wrong side of the fabric and ironing it.

# Cutting your Fabric

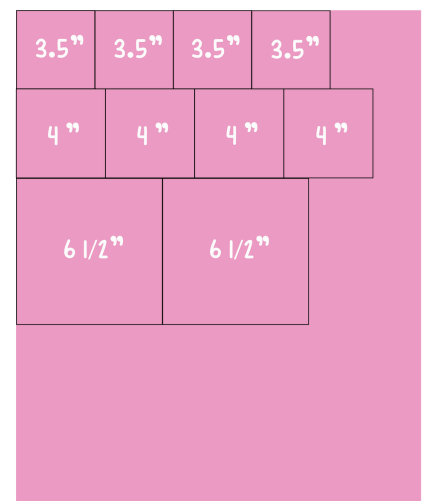
## Background Fabric

- Cut your fabric for both the 8 star point block and the nine patch variation block according to the table below.

Background Fabric	(Cut 3) 3 1/2" x WOF <u>SUBCUT</u> (Cut 32) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"  (Cut 2) 7 1/4" x WOF <u>SUBCUT</u> (Cut 8) 7 1/4" x 7 1/4"  (Cut 3) 6 1/2" x WOF <u>SUBCUT</u> (Cut 32) 6 1/2" x 3 1/2"	(Cut 6) 3 1/2" x WOF <u>SUBCUT</u> (Cut 72) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"  (Cut 4) 7 1/4" x WOF <u>SUBCUT</u> (Cut 18) 7 1/4" x 7 1/4"  (Cut 6) 6 1/2" x WOF <u>SUBCUT</u> (Cut 72) 6 1/2" x 3 1/2"	(Cut 8) 3 1/2" x WOF <u>SUBCUT</u> (Cut 96) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"  (Cut 6) 7 1/4" x WOF <u>SUBCUT</u> (Cut 24) 7 1/4" x 7 1/4"  (Cut 8) 6 1/2" x WOF <u>SUBCUT</u> (Cut 96) 6 1/2" x 3 1/2"	(Cut 11) 3 1/2" x WOF <u>SUBCUT</u> (Cut 128) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"  (Cut 8) 7 1/4" x WOF <u>SUBCUT</u> (Cut 32) 7 1/4" x 7 1/4"  (Cut 11) 6 1/2" x WOF <u>SUBCUT</u> (Cut 128) 6 1/2" x 3 1/2"

## Fat Quarters

- Use each FQ for both the nine patch and 8 point block star fabric



\*\*You can also fussy cut the 6 1/2" center block

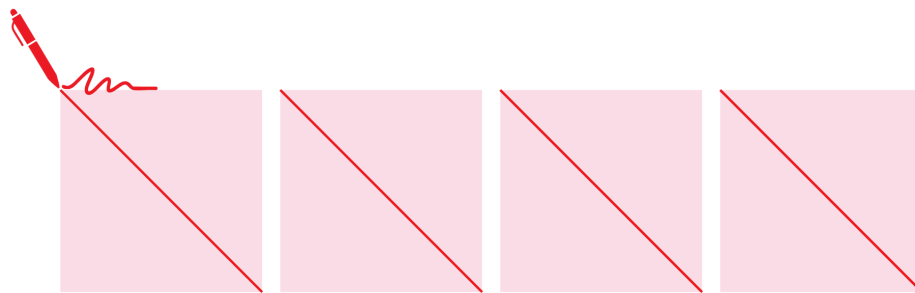


## Block Assembly

After prepping and cutting our fabric is completed, start assembling the Nine Patch Variation & 8 point star blocks.

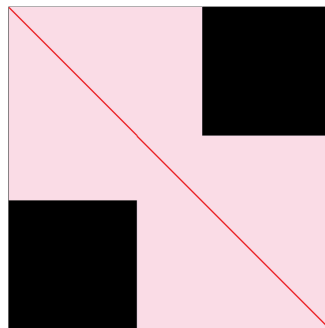
## Eight Point Star Block

### Creating the Flying Geese



**Fig (1)**

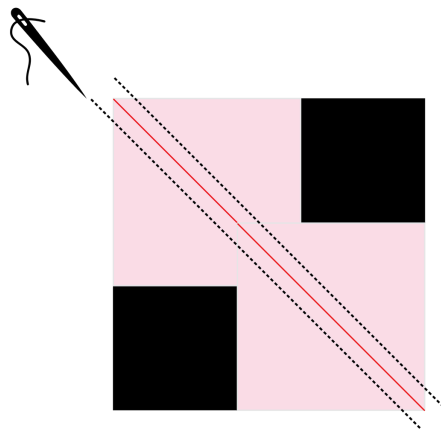
- Draw diagonal lines across your 4" featured fabric on the wrong side of the fabric. Fig(1)

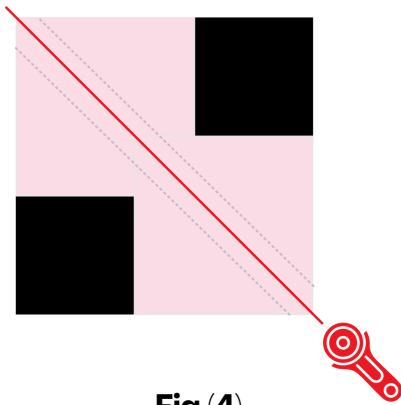
- With background fabric right side up, place two 4" featured fabric right side down (RST), lining up the diagonal lines. With the two squares, there will be overlapping corners in the middle. Fig(2)



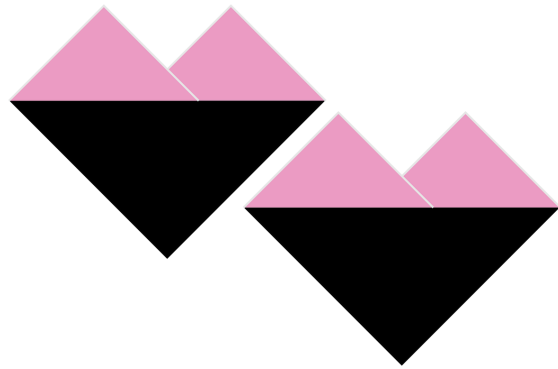


**Fig (3)**

- Pin and sew 1/4 inch on both sides of the line. Fig(3)

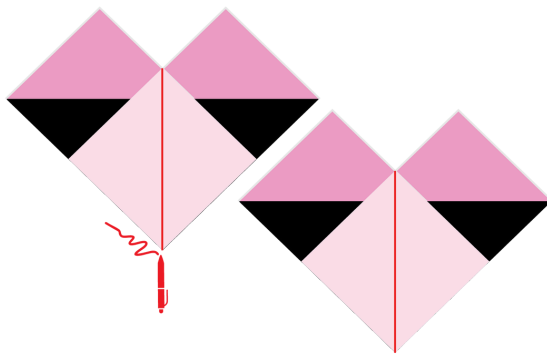

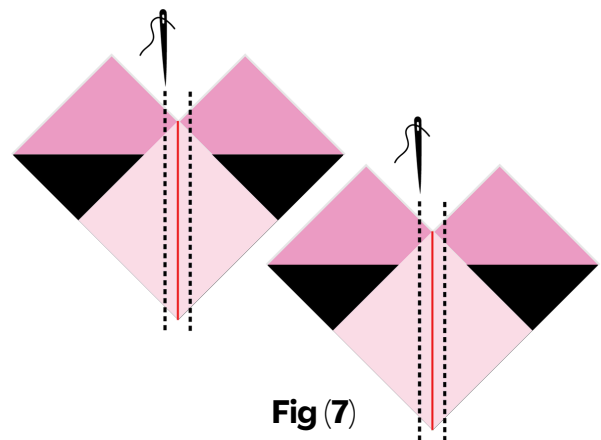


**Fig (5)**

- Cut the unit in half on the drawn diagonal line. Press the seam towards 4" featured fabric. Fig(4) This will leave you with 2 units. Fig(5)



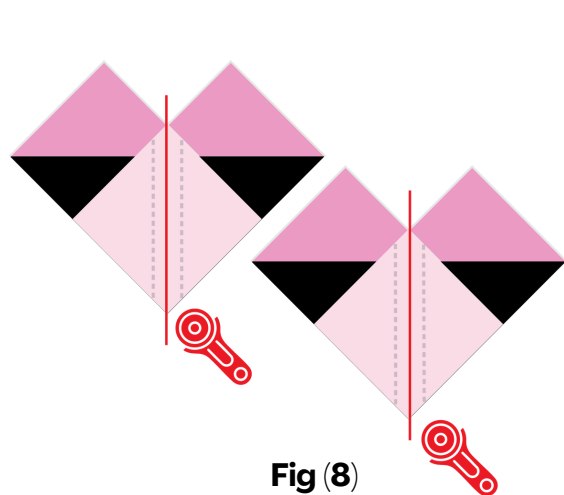

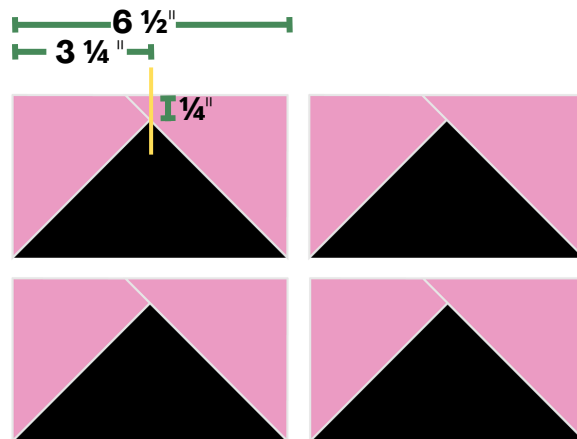

- Place 1 more featured fabric in the corner of each unit, mark diagonal lines across your 4" featured fabric. Fig(6)
- Pin and sew 1/4 inch on both sides of the line. Fig(7)





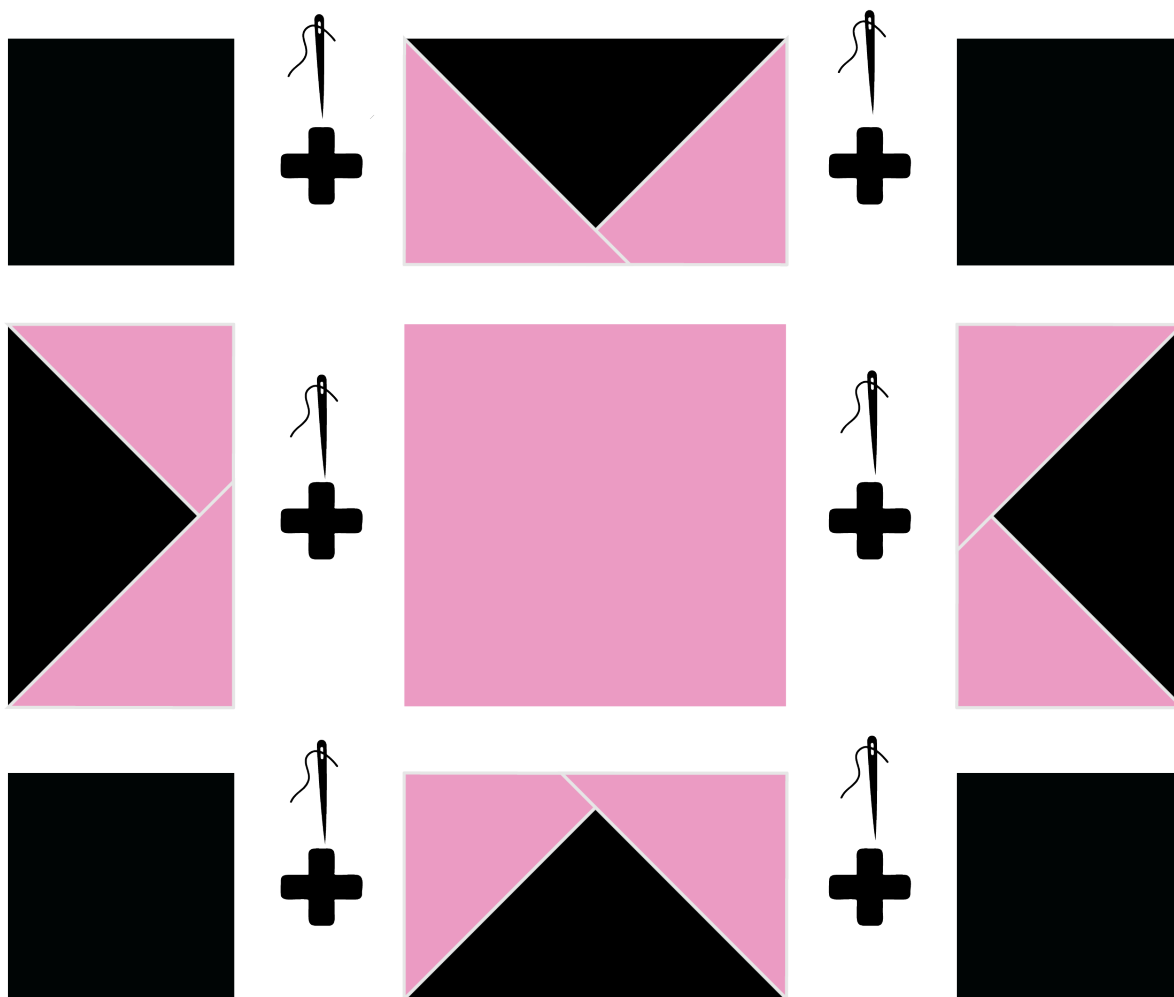

- Cut on the diagonal line and press seams toward featured fabric. Fig(8)
- You will now have four Flying Geese units. Square up your flying geese units to measure 3 1/2" x 6 1/2". make sure the center is at 3.25". Fig (9)

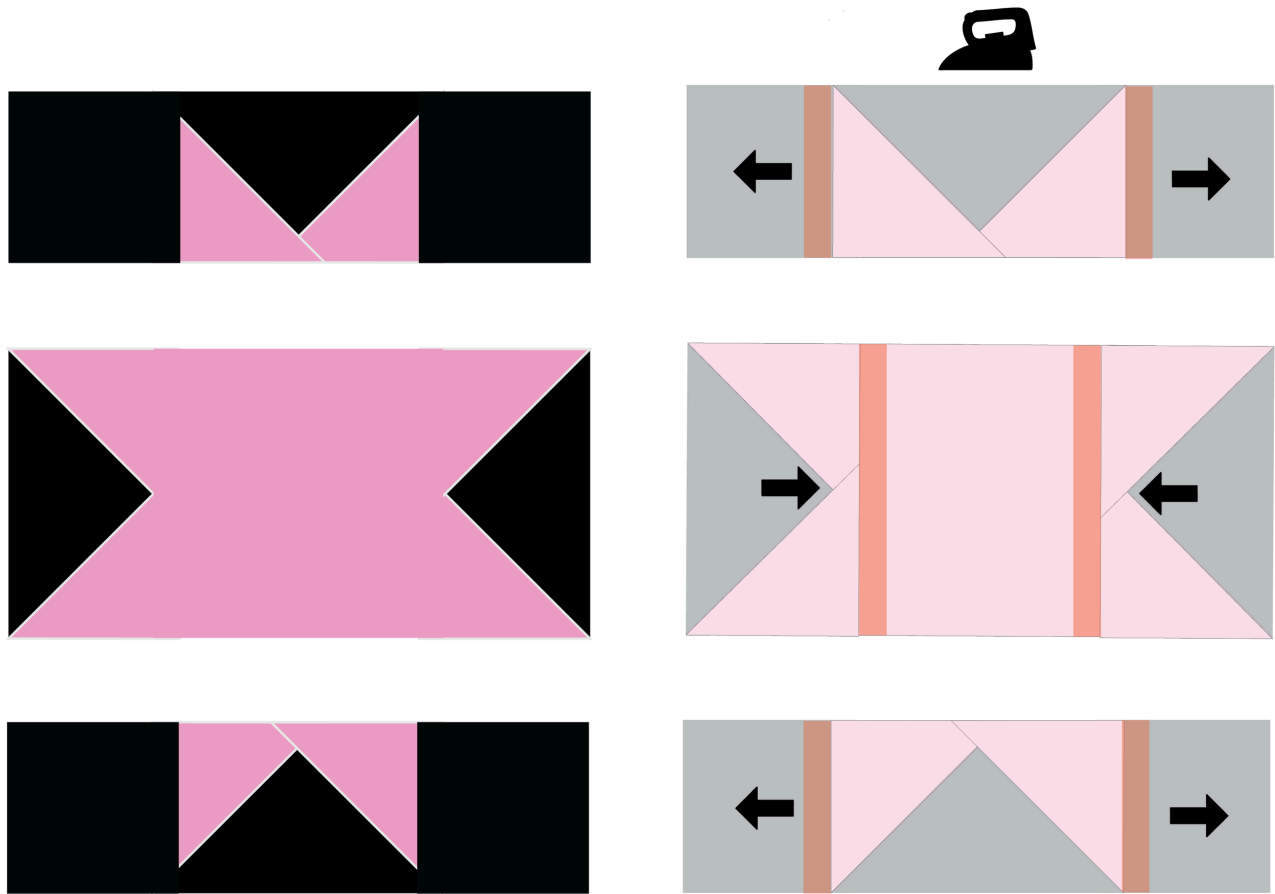
### Putting your block together

- Now you want to sew your horizontal rows together as shown above.



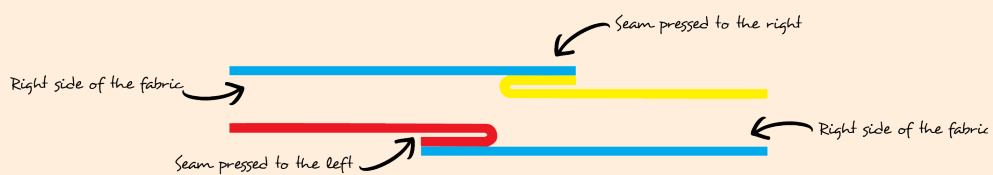

- Press your seams according to the arrows so they nest\* properly. Fig(11)

## *What is seam nesting and how to achieve it?*

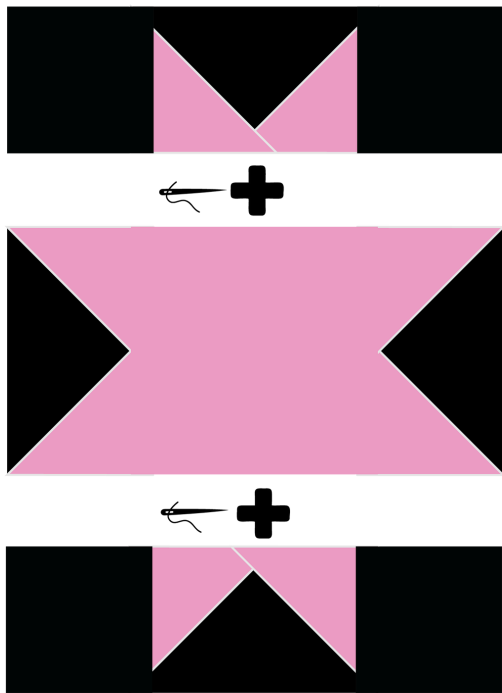
### Seam nesting Side View



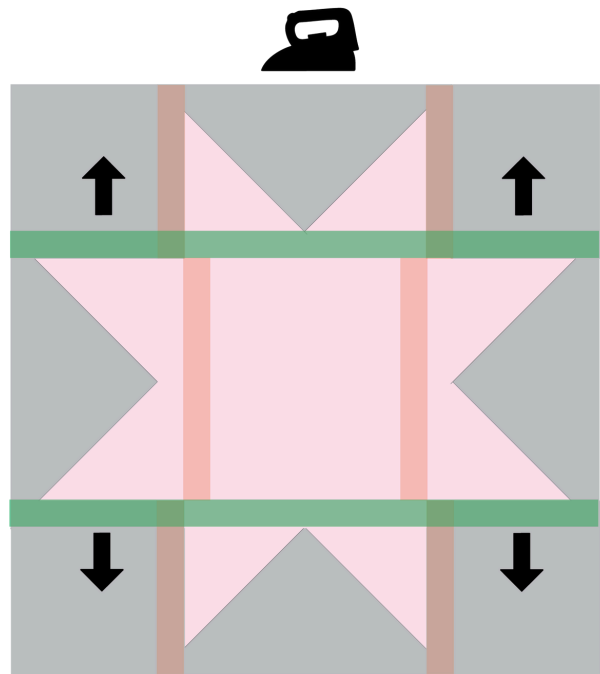
### Nested Seams



"seam nesting" is a technique where seams are pressed in alternating directions. the two fabrics almost interlock as you sew, this helps reduce bulk and ensure seams meet precisely at intersections, creating crisp, flat quilt top

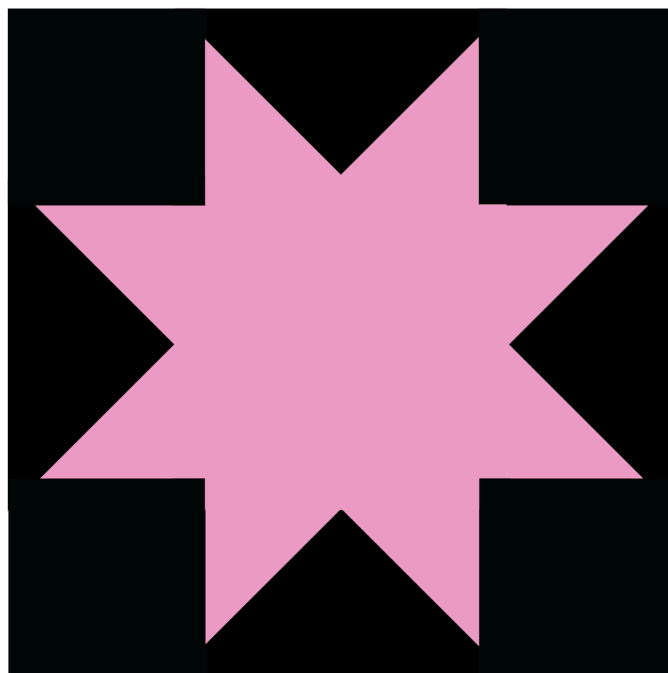

- Sew your vertical rows together. Fig(12)
- After you've sewn your vertical rows, press the seams according to the arrows above. Fig(13)



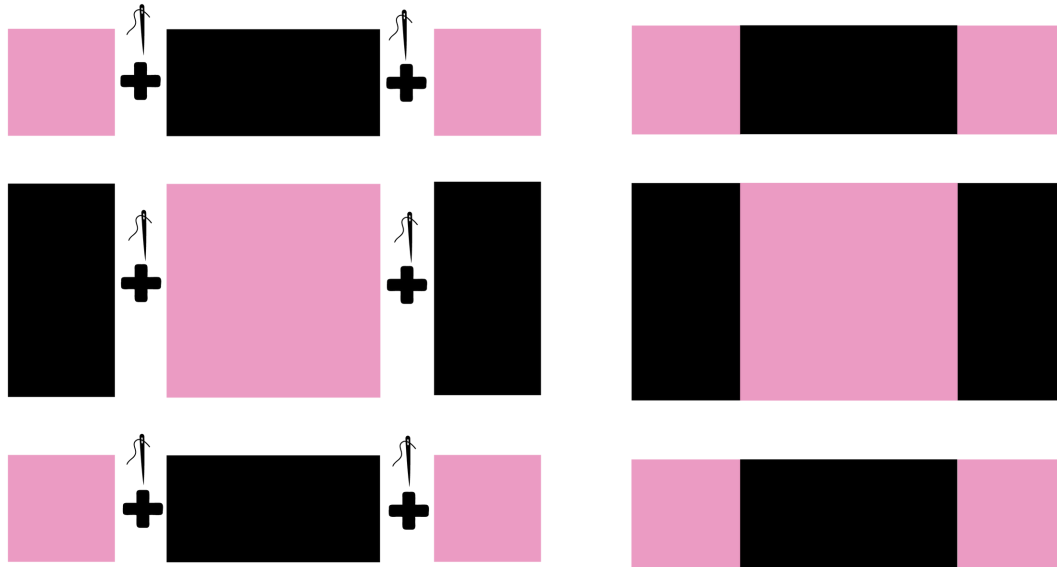

- Press, then trim to 12 ½" x 12 ½". Fig(14)



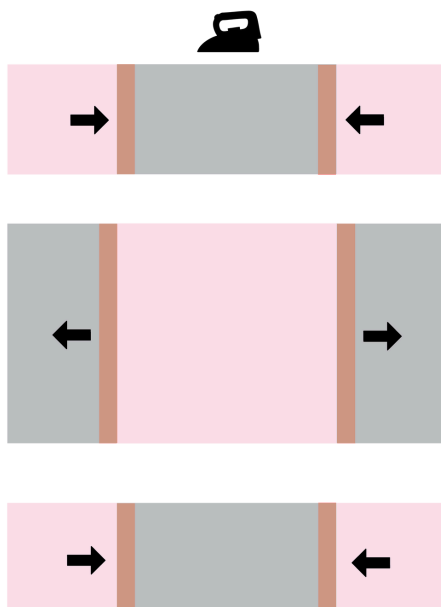
# Nine Patch Variation Block

## Assembling the Nine Patch Variation Block

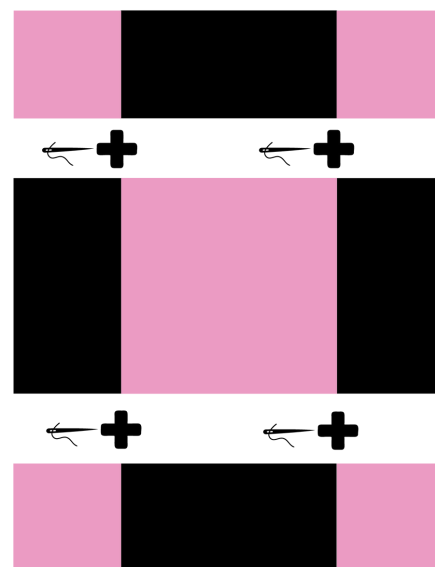

- Sew your horizontal rows together as shown above. Fig(15)

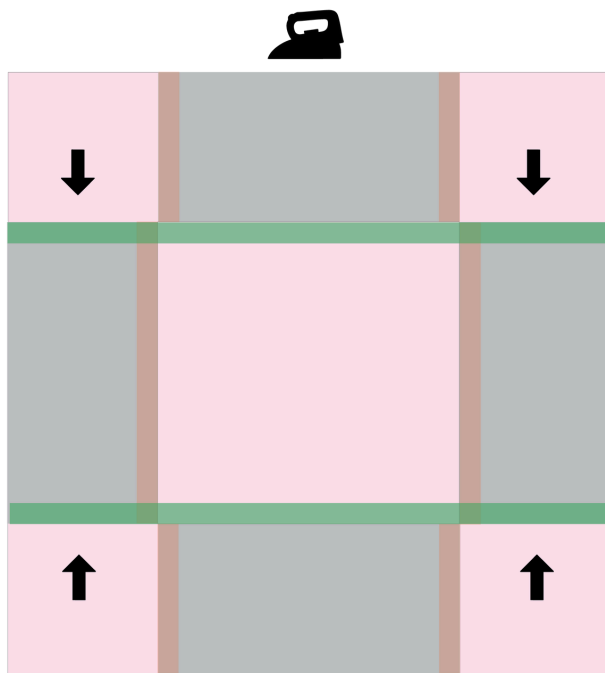

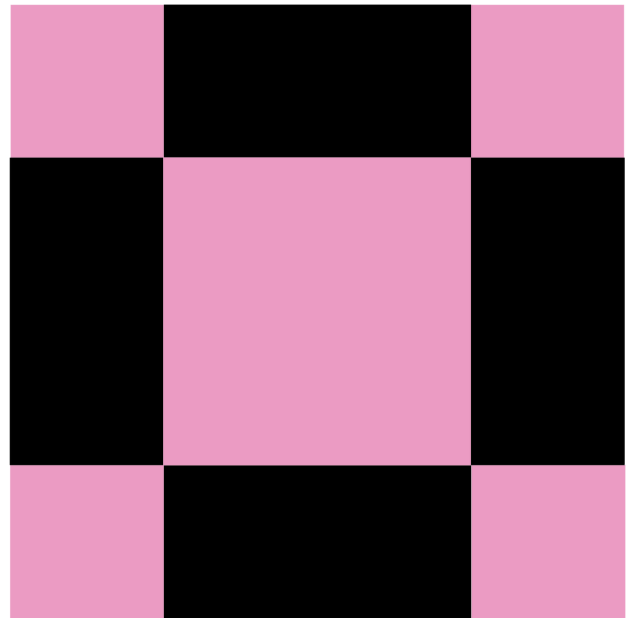


**Fig (17)**

- After you've sewn your blocks together press your seams according to the arrows so they nest properly. Fig(16)
- After you've pressed your blocks, sew your vertical rows together as shown above. Fig(17)

- After you've sewn your vertical rows, press the seams according to the arrows above. Fig(18)
- Press your block, then trim to 12 ½" x 12 ½". Fig(19)

Nine Patch Block	8 Blocks	18 Blocks	24 Blocks	32 Blocks
8 pointed star block	8 Blocks	18 Blocks	24 Blocks	32 Blocks
<b>TOTAL BLOCKS NEEDED</b>	<b>26 Blocks</b>	<b>36 Blocks</b>	<b>48 Blocks</b>	<b>64 Blocks</b>
